TOWN COUNCIL NEWS - JAN WISE

MEETINGS: At our August meeting we had LA Co Dept. of Agriculture come and give us an overview of their dept., focusing on weed abatement. They are responsible for inspecting vacant land parcels. Juniper Hills had 56 parcels that were in non-compliance, and LA Co. cleared 17 of them as of our August meeting. If you need a parcel inspected near your property, call 661-974-8801.

Your town council also wrote a letter to all of our local, state, and federal representatives regarding settlements from the Bobcat Fire, and asking to be included in legislation exempting payments from state taxes. Julie Drake from the AV Press wrote a great article on our community 3 years after the Bobcat Fire.

ONGOING ISSUES: Illegal dumping continues to be an issue, you can report illegal dumping to: dumping@publicworks.lacounty.gov, or call 1-888-838-6746, or on the LA County Works app. Vouchers are available after July 1st for ½ ton per residence per year, call Supervisor Barger's office at 661-726-3600 to get them.

Please continue to report to the Marijuana Tips line illegal grows at <u>Marijuanatips@lasd.org</u>. The Sheriff's Dept. now has more funding, and are taking the illegal grows down on a weekly basis.

MONTHLY MEETINGS: The JHTC meets on the first Wednesday of every month (except January and July) at 7 p.m. at the Juniper Hills Community Center.

JUNIPER HILLS HISTORY COMMITTEE

The history committee took a break in 2023. Our plan for this year is to finish organizing the files and boxes of paperwork that is stored at the community center. Also, to work on the brochure that was started. We welcome new volunteers to join us at the community center on the last Friday of each month at 10:00am.

CERT

The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) concept was developed and implemented by the Los Angeles City Fire Department in 1985. The Whittier Narrows earthquake in 1987 underscored the area-wide threat of a major disaster in California. Further, it confirmed the need for training civilians to meet their immediate needs. The program educates volunteers about disaster preparedness and for the hazards that may occur where they live. CERT trains volunteers in basic disaster response skills, such as: Fire safety. Light search and rescue.

CERT became a national program in 1993. There are now CERT programs in all 50 states, including many tribal nations and U.S. territories. Each is unique to its community and all are essential to building a Culture of Preparedness in the United States. There are over 2,700 local CERT programs nationwide and more than 600,000 people have trained since CERT became a national program.
